

## Precious Metal Clay Possibilities with Glass

- Glass cabochon, Swarovski crystal you wish to work, if desired (some glass pieces will be supplied in class, too)
- Scissors
- Small wire brush (Home Depot – looks like an oversized toothbrush)
- Sharpie markers: ultra fine and fine (skinny tip and regular tip)
- Small travel pkg. of baby wipes
- Paint Brush - #3 round
- Clay blade – Michael's or Joann's
- Playing cards (at least 12, people can share a deck)
- one roller approx. 1" dia. by 6" long (can be cut from PVC pipe or plexiglas rollers are available at Joann's or Michael's in the modeling clay dept.)
- Small paint brush - #3 round
- Clay Shaper' or 'Colour Shaper' tool, taper (cone shaped) # 2, FIRM/black color. Comes in different shapes and hardness. Available at: **Bellevue Art and Frame**, Daniel Smith, Inc.,
